## The Compulsory Core Curriculum

At the Fernwood School we are proud to offer a high-quality curriculum with academic rigour (Progress 0.42 ), breadth, balance and a blend of both traditional \& new GCSEs as well as practical, vocational \& technical awards.

The compulsory core curriculum shows a commitment and determination to providing all students with a broad and balanced curriculum to the end of their learning journey here at Fernwood. It consists of:

- English Language
- English Literature
- Mathematics
- Combined Science (Students can choose as an option to take Triple Science - Pathway 1 \& 2)
- Religious Education (1 hour per week)
- Personal Development (1 hour per week)
- Core PE

Students will then have up to 4 choices, depending on which Pathway they have been designated.

## The EBacc - ENGLISH BACCALAUREATE

The EBacc is a set of subjects at GCSE that keeps young people's options open for further study and future careers. These are highly regarded, traditionally academic subjects which lend themselves well to A-Level, further education, vocational courses and university studies.

These subjects complement other GCSE options courses including practical and vocational courses.
The EBacc recognises where students have achieved a grade 4 or above at GCSE in English, Maths, Sciences, a language and a humanities subject.

The subjects that are included in the EBacc are:

- English
- Mathematics
- Science / Computer Science
- French or German (a modern foreign language)
- Geography or History (a humanities subject)

Our attainment and progress in these subjects is strong and significantly above the national average.

The demographic of our intake suggests we should have at least 50\% of our students qualifying for the EBacc.

The Fernwood School will recognise each student's commitment to this suite of subjects and students will receive a school certificate if they are successful in achieving the English Baccalaureate at Grade 4 or above.

## Option Choices 2023-24

- At Fernwood we continue to be able to offer a fantastic choice to our students with a total of 21 different courses available.
- Offering breadth, depth and accessibility to suit our students' needs, aspirations and learning styles.
- The choices are set up in blocks with many combinations of courses available. Experience has led us to set these up in this way to ensure a greater proportion of students get all of their option choices.


## Options Conditions

- However, whilst there are many choices available; staffing, resources, facilities and rooms need to be considered. To be able to continue to offer the wealth of options to students and to enable more students to receive their first choices, students will be required to choose from a smaller group of subjects first.
- These subjects are highly regarded for further study, both at college and university, offering a strong foundation, breadth, depth and balance, particularly when taken in combination with other practical, written and vocational subjects.
- The subject performance in each of these subjects is very strong.


## Options Conditions

- Pathway 1-(EBacc Strongly Advised History or Geography AND French or German) students will therefore choose 2 options from (Triple Science, History, Geography, French and German) then 2 free options.
- The vast majority of students on Pathway 1 should be doing the language and a humanities subject.
- Pathway 2 students will therefore choose 1 option from (Triple Science, History, Geography, French and German) then 2 free options.
- This gives both pathways an equal amount of free option choices.
- There is still choice within this set of subjects, as well as a great deal of choice after these choices are made.

## GCSE French \& German

A language GCSE is an important component of the EBac qualification, which many universities look at to give them an indication of what can set one student apart from another. Aside from that, languages are becoming ever more essential in today's world market, whatever your speciality, and are a skill for life which employers value highly.

At Fernwood, we offer a choice of two European languages, French or German. These are the languages most in demand by UK businesses. You can choose one of them, or you can take both! Students will follow a full GCSE course in French and/o both! Stı

Students who have studied history have access to a wide range of careers and employment opportunities such as in law, politics, the media, accountancy, corporate management, teaching, work in museums and research, archaeology, the civil service, lecturing, personnel and many more that require skills in organising information, working with people and expressing your ideas in a logical and ordered way.
